Attached are the final FY 2018 and FY 2019 Assistance to Small and Disadvantaged Communities grant allotments, authorized under Section 2104 of the Water Infrastructure Improvements for the Nation Act (WIIN Act). The final amount available for this program is \$42,854,000. Attached are the state and territorial allotments as well as the total amount available to support tribal water systems.

The following steps support the implementation of this grant:

- Early this summer, DWPD will publish an implementation document, including grant eligibility criteria, which will be made available at www.epa.gov/safewater/grants.
- The regions will then work with the applicants to review their draft workplans and budget narratives.
- Late in the summer, DWPD will open the grant application in Grants.gov.
- The regions will approve the final grant application package.
