Re: Petition for Exemption from 40 CFR Part 63, Subpart HHHHHH

Dear Ms. Morin:

This letter is in response to your January 7, 2020 petition for exemption (petition) from the motor vehicle and mobile equipment surface coating requirements of the National Emission Standard for Hazardous Air Pollutants, Paint Stripping and Miscellaneous Surface Coating Operations at Area Sources, 40 CFR part 63, subpart HHHHHH (Subpart HHHHHH) for the following Gerber Collision & Glass facilities located in Colorado at:

- 10755 Maltese Point Falcon
- 133 Marand Rd. Glenwood Springs
- 1210 Devereux Rd. Glenwood Springs
- 569 25 1/2 Rd. Grand Junction
- 939 South Ave. Grand Junction
- 6208 E. County Line Road Highlands Ranch

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency grants your petitions for exemption.

To obtain an exemption, 40 CFR 63.11170(a)(2) requires that as the owner or operator of a motor vehicle surface coating operation you demonstrate, to the EPA's satisfaction, that you spray apply no coatings that contain the target hazardous air pollutants (HAP), as defined in 40 CFR 63.11180. The petition must include a description of the coatings that you spray apply and your certification that you do not spray apply any coatings containing the target HAP.

Based upon the information provided in your petitions for the Gerber Collision & Glass facilities identified above and your signed certification that none of the coatings sprayed at these facilities contain the target HAP, the Gerber Collision & Glass facilities identified above are exempt from the Subpart HHHHHH requirements for their spray-applied coating activities, but they must still comply with any applicable requirements for paint stripping when using methylene chloride.

Keep a record of the exemption on site at your facilities for as long as you perform motor vehicle and mobile equipment surface coating operations. If circumstances change such that you intend to spray apply coatings containing any target HAP, the owner or operator must submit the initial notification required by 40 CFR 63.11175 and comply with the requirements of Subpart HHHHHH.

This exemption is based on information that you have provided to the EPA. Nothing in this exemption shall be construed as limiting the ability of the EPA or delegated agencies to pursue enforcement action, if it is determined that you were not eligible for this exemption or for any other violations under the Clean Air Act. Providing false information to a federal official is a criminal violation pursuant to federal law, 18 U.S.C. Section 1001.
